

To those interested in attending my Island Knitting Retreats:

I hold annual Spring and Fall Island Knitting Retreats at Lakedale Resort in Friday Harbor, on beautiful San Juan Island, where I live. Our islands are a nature-lover's paradise, located about 100 miles by car north of Seattle, and an hour-and-a-half ferry ride west through shimmering emerald waters. Along the way you might see whales, dolphins, sea lions, seals, eagles, falcons, or osprey. Knitters who have joined me in the past fall in love with the beauty and peace, just as I did many years ago.



Arrival is Sunday, with departure Friday morning, giving us four complete days together. My knitters love the luxurious accommodations, our gathering space (see above), and the lovingly prepared delicious, healthy meals, which are legendary among returnees. All participants receive enticing goodie bags.

Remaining 2012 retreat are full, but you may request to be put on the wait list.

I teach every morning and afternoons are free. Each evening, after dinner, I review the morning's lessons, offer lots of one-on-one help, and tell stories from the knitting world. If the interisland ferry schedule cooperates, many knitters choose to spend an afternoon floating among islands, enjoying spectacular scenery while knitting and talking. One afternoon a fiber purveyor from Lopez Island sets up shop in the lobby for us. With afternoons wide open, you can nap, hike, visit the Whale Museum or galleries, shop, or canoe on the lake. At South Beach you could try knitting with driftwood and kelp, and may see foxes, rabbits, and eagles. You can feed apples to Mona, a friendly island camel, visit Krystal Acres Alpaca Farm, or relax with your knitting and new friends in the lodge.





In all six retreats, I teach mini-workshops on many of the techniques I am known for. You can also bring along any knitting project and ask me for help. My students particularly enjoy learning about and trying my “secret” new techniques and designs as much as a year before they are made public.

The three Spring Retreats are distinguished by their focus on gift projects: you can spoil yourself while simultaneously creating gifts for loved ones. Spring knitters receive a small collection of my unpublished patterns, mostly for one skein, and may complete several projects.

The three Fall Retreats include what I call Forensic Knitting: a variety of inroads for exploring and investigating how knitting works and discovering intoxicating new possibilities. Both spring and fall retreats are deeply relaxing, stimulating, and

have a strong sense of community and caring. My fall retreats are usually filled by returnees, but my spring retreats, which are in only their second year, still have room to welcome newcomers.

The retreat fee is \$375, not including lodging and meals. We get special rates at Lakedale; if you visit their web site (www.lakedale.com), ignore the listed prices. For us, the wonderfully comfortable lodge rooms, with free wifi, gas fireplaces, Jacuzzi tubs, and balconies or decks overlooking the lake are currently \$124 per night. Cabins with two bedrooms, two bathrooms, and a kitchen are \$166 for two people. The cabins are a short walk from the lodge where we gather for classes and meals; the farthest is less than two minutes, over level ground. Breakfast is included in the lodging cost. Our catered lunches and dinners Monday through Thursday are \$200, and the meals are legendary among returnees.

To register, email me to check to see if the retreat you want has space, then please print and fill out the registration form on page 4 and send it to me with your deposit. I will hold your spot so long as I receive your check in a timely fashion. I do keep a wait list (cancellations do come in, often within a month or two of the event, so if you have a flexible schedule you are most likely to get in). Travel information is on page 3.

I hope to see you at one of my 2012 retreats, and to enjoy getting to know you as we knit together.

Washington State Ferries

Island Airporter (for departure only)

A Friday Harbor based shuttle runs directly between Seatac (Seattle- Tacoma Airport) and Friday Harbor every week-day. If your Friday departure schedule can match it, you won't need to carry your luggage on the ferry (it will be in the van). For an extra fee owner John Nash will pick you up at Lakedale. Bellair Charters Airporter Shuttle

This service offers 12 roundtrips daily between Seatac (Seattle- Tacoma Airport) and the Anacortes Ferry Terminal. The trip is lengthened by additional stops en route. Current schedules and rates are available at www.airporter.com/shuttle. Make sure to allow at least 45 minutes between the scheduled arrival time of the shuttle and the ferry's departure, in case the shuttle runs into traffic.

Rental Cars

Seatac Airport has many national rental car chains. If driving to the Anacortes Ferry Terminal, it is prudent to arrive 1 hour prior to your scheduled sailing, since ferries do overload. It takes about 2 hours to drive directly from the airport to Anacortes. If using GPS, type in Anacortes, not Friday Harbor, or it will send you by an insanely longer route via Whidbey Island and a second ferry.

Kenmore Air

For those who prefer to fly (and to see beautiful sights!), Kenmore Air offers both land and sea plane services. Those traveling by land plane are shuttled between Seatac (Seattle-Tacoma Airport) and Boeing Field. Those traveling by sea plane are shuttled from Seatac to Lake Union and land in the Friday Harbor Marina. Current schedules as well as reservation information can be found at www.kenmoreair.com. Before making reservations, make sure to coordinate your arrival and departure from Seatac with Kenmore's schedule, allowing enough time to collect your baggage.

Lodging: After I confirm your registration, phone Lakedale at 1-800-617-2267 to reserve a lodge room or a cabin. Our rates (subject to change, but unlikely to rise more than a few dollars) are \$124 per night for a lodge room or \$166 for a cabin (with 2 bedrooms, 2 bathrooms, a kitchen and living area). If you would like a cabin mate, please let both me and the lodge know and we will try to match you with someone. Arrival is Sunday afternoon/evening, and departure is Friday morning.

Meals: Lakedale provides breakfast. You will mail Deb Nolan, our lunch and dinner kitchen magician, a \$200 check (made out to her) a month before the retreat, also letting her know if you have any special food needs. Her address is: Deb Nolan, 14 Fieldstone Rd, Friday Harbor WA 98250
